



Grade 2









In one of the reading lessons for Diwali Festival, students worked in groups and were asked to rearrange the order of a reading passage that was cut into sections. They were excited to engage in an interactive reading lesson.

Afterwards, they had to apply the use of 5 WH- question words they have learnt in the previous lesson to create questions and answers for the reading passage.

What is Diwali?

Diwali is "The Festival of Lights". It is about the goddess of weath

Diwall is a major Hindus festival throughout India, It falls between October and November every year.

Diwali means rows of lighted lamps and the celebration is called 'The Festival of Lights'. For weeks before Diwali, Hindus prepare themselves and their homes for the festival. Homes are cleaned and redecorated. Some Hindus pray to Lakshmi, the goddess of wealth. The Hindus strongly believe that Lakshmi will not enter any homes where there is uncleanliness.

During the festival, all windows are wide opened to welcome the arrival of Lakshmi. Candles and lamps are also lit as a greeting to the goddess. In some parts of India, the sky is lit up with fireworks as well. In addition, gitts are exchanged and festive meals are prepared during Diwali.

Children love Diwali because they are all given new clothes to wear and are loaded with gifts. They also act out the ancient state of Rama and Sita using dolls and puppets.



The Third-Graders have been exploring different countries in Module 1. We learned facts about Brazil and Australia. Now, Module 1 has come to an end and it's PROJECT TIME! In groups, we worked on an information board about a country we have chosen. We looked for information about that country, for example, important historical events, famous festivals/landmarks, traditional clothing, special plants/animals and many more. We presented our information boards in class and we learned about different countries from the others' presentations.







Grade 4

Our Fourth-Graders have just finished their fantastic learning 'journey' to the Amazon rainforest. They all worked hard to explore some amazing species that are living in the Amazon. Not only were they getting to know the names of animals and plants, but also the different layers that they live in. By the end of this module, everyone has learned and understood the importance of saving and protecting our rainforests on Earth.

For the comprehensive project, our students had to work in groups with others to perform a sketch by writing a script and acting it out. It was such a meaningful task for our young global citizens to create something that shows their concerns about saving rainforests. Their scripts between a news reporter and the rainforest animals were so interesting and educational! Some groups even made their own props to help others understand their presentation... what a fantastic idea! Our children are really creative! Grade 5



Time flies, Grade 5 Module 1 is coming to an end soon. Throughout the module, students learned about different spying skills. They learned how to tail a person, how to blend in, communicate with their partner using different kind of codes, and create gadgets to help their mission.


This week, students started to present their final project, which is a report to tell us about their mission. Students created their own mission and they share how they disguised themselves and blended in throughout their mission.





Grade 6

In Module 1, "Different People, Same World", we learned about different forms of discriminations and inequalities faced by people nowadays. Through studying real cases and reading books about famous civil rights activists, like Martin Luther King Jr. and Rosa Parks, the Sixth-Graders come to realise that discrimination doesn't just happen in Asia, it could happen anywhere in the world.



In the project, students used some writing skills learned in lessons to write a news article about a discrimination case that they read in the newspaper or online. To make it more interesting, they were encouraged to make short video clips and pretended to be little news reporters to report on the cases! How fun!
