
The ocean is a dangerous place. If you were a fish, where would you hide your eggs to protect them from harm and danger? Let's look at what the Grade 1 children said!






~Welcome to Hong Kong ~


Hong Kong is one of the most densely-populated places in the world, yet there are many interesting places to visit.

~ Seeds on the Move ~




Our 3rd Graders are currently still busy in Module 2 "The World of Plants". In the past few weeks, students have learnt about Seed Dispersal. Plants need to disperse their seeds from themselves to create new colonies. Different kinds of seeds are dispersed in various ways.

In this module we have learnt the four basic ways for plants to spread their seeds. They are Water, Wind, Animals and Explosion.

Students brought some seeds to class and discussed with their friends how different seeds are dispersed. Students then created a 3D comic strip about the special journey of a seed. Students used the real seeds in their comic strip! How would a real plant grow in a comic strip?

In the journey, the seeds had some special experiences and they met some friends who carried them to different places. Want to know what happened to the seeds at the end of the journey? Let's have a look at the students' creative work!





~Volcanoes Rock! ~

The Grade 4 Module 2 is coming to an end and we learned so much about different natural disasters. We covered tsunamis, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, landslides and floods. After coming back from the Chinese New Year holiday, we went to the Sai Kung High Island Reservoir to look at volcanic rocks. We entered the Hong Kong Geopark and walked around the East Dam. On the coast of High Island, we could see many hexagonal rock columns. Those hexagonal rock columns are rare natural wonders, created from volcanic materials under unique environmental conditions. They were formed 140 million years ago and we can see them in a lot of places in Sai Kung. We had three guides and they were very informative. They told us how the hexagonal rock columns in Hong Kong are very special because they are red in colour; in other places, they are mainly black. We were also able to touch the volcanic rocks and take pictures with and of them. Take a look at us and the beautiful sights!
















Our Grade 6 students are finishing their second Module: **The Wonders of Science**. Q: Of all the classes that you have taught, which class is the most memorable to you?


A: To me, it is currently class 6 Maple.

A: My motto is For God So Loved The World.











